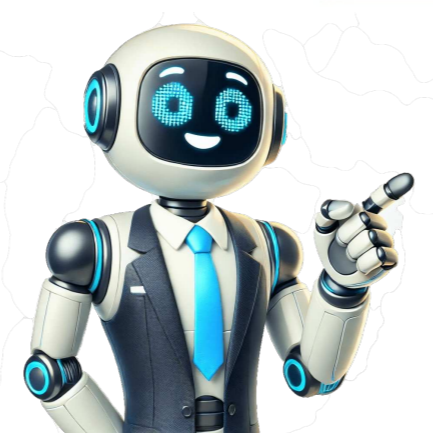

Ole Miss football player Corey Adams has died in Cordova, Tennessee, according to an announcement from the program on July 20. Adams, 18, was identified as a homicide victim by the Shelby County Sheriff's Office in Tennessee in a post on X. According to police, a shooting took place at 10:14 p.m. CT on July 19 outside a residence on Fern Glade Cove in Cordova, a suburb east of Memphis. The sheriff's office reported finding one male gunshot victim after stopping a vehicle at the intersection of Forest Hill-Irene and Walnut Grove roads. He was provided life-saving measures until Shelby County Fire arrived, later pronouncing Adams dead on the scene. Four other adult males arrived at Memphis-area hospitals with gunshot wounds and are in non-critical condition, according to the post from the Shelby County Sheriff's Office. Multiple shell casings were found on the scene. Adams was a three-star prospect and a freshman who committed to Ole Miss over offers from Oregon, TCU, USC and others. He was a 6-foot-4 edge rusher from New Orleans. He went to Edna Karr High School. "We are devastated to learn that Corey Adams, a freshman on the team, passed away last night in Cordova, Tennessee," Ole Miss wrote in a statement. "While our program is trying to cope with the tragic loss, our thoughts are with his loved ones during this incredibly difficult time." "Out of respect for his family, we will not be commenting further at this time. We ask the Ole Miss community to keep Corey in their thoughts and respect the privacy of everyone involved." Officers discovered one male gunshot victim after stopping a vehicle at an intersection. The male, later identified as Adams, received life-saving measures but was subsequently pronounced dead on the scene. Multiple shell casings were discovered on the scene. Four other males arrived at Memphis area hospitals with gunshot wounds, all of whom were in non-critical condition. Adams signed with Ole Miss as a 247Sports three-star recruit and the No. 27 overall recruit out of the state of Louisiana. He attended New Orleans Edna Karr High School, and enrolled early with Lane Kiffin and the Rebels in order to participate in spring practice. The Shelby County Sheriff said an investigation is ongoing. Adams, a top player on the Karr football team that won a state championship last season, was found in a vehicle after a shooting that took place before 10:15 p.m. outside a residence in Cordova, Tennessee. The deputies attempted "life-saving measures," the release said, and he was pronounced dead at the scene. Adams, listed as a freshman on the football team at Ole Miss, was among five shooting victims, the release said. The other four arrived in personal vehicles at area hospitals and are listed in non-critical condition, according to the Shelby County Sheriff's Office. Deputies found multiple shell casings at the scene, the Sheriff's Office said. The Times-Picayune selected Adams as the all-metro defensive player of the year after the 6-foot-4, 250-pound standout ended the season with 47 tackles, including 15 sacks along with four forced fumbles. Adams, 18, was twice selected by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association to the Class 5A all-state team. The LSWA also selected him as the 5A defensive player of the year in 2024. Catholic League coaches selected him as the all-district defensive MVP last season. Adams had a sideline-to-sideline presence while also working his way into opposing team backfields, making him one of the more dominant defensive players in the New Orleans metro area. Among his more memorable plays was when he wrestled the football from the Holy Cross quarterback and ran 70 yards for a touchdown during a game in 2023. "I do a lot of wild stuff on the field," Adams said during media interviews after the school celebrated his college signing in December. "My coach was not lying. I really do some crazy stuff. I'm aggressive. I'm hard. You can't make me bow down. Somebody is going to have to surrender when I'm on the field. I don't fear nobody, and that's how it's going to stay." Adams arrived at Ole Miss in January as an early enrollee so that he could participate in spring practices ahead of his first college season. The Edna Karr football Facebook page said the community was "heartbroken and tormented to pieces," and remembered Adams on Sunday as "a friend, brother, son, student, and all around great young man." Ole Miss said the football program "is trying to cope with this tragic loss," according to a statement from the Ole Miss football program, and "our thoughts are with his loved ones during this incredibly difficult time." Anyone with information is encouraged to call Crimestoppers at 528-CASH. As of Monday morning, no arrests have been made in connection with the killing of Adams. Adams was a defensive lineman from New Orleans who began practicing with the University of Mississippi in early 2025. Before the 2025 football season, Adams enrolled and joined the Ole Miss football team for spring practice in early 2025. Adams was a three-star prospect and a freshman who committed to Ole Miss over offers from Oregon, TCU, USC and others. He was a 6-foot-4 edge rusher from New Orleans. Sheriff's Office said in a statement that it is investigating a shooting that took place at around 10:14 p.m. Saturday night outside a residence in Cordova. "When deputies arrived at the intersection of Forest Hill-Irene and Walnut Grove, they stopped a vehicle, finding an adult male gunshot victim," the sheriff's office stated. "They provided life-saving measures until Shelby County Fire arrived. Shelby County Fire personnel later pronounced the victim deceased on the scene." A second statement, issued hours later early Sunday morning, identified the victim as Adams. The sheriff's department also noted that "four adult males arrived by personal vehicles to area hospitals with gunshot wounds. All four victims are listed in non-critical condition." The shooting is an active homicide investigation, the department stated. According to his Mississippi bio, Adams was a two-time all-state selection who had 19 sacks, 62 tackles (21 for loss), one fumble recovery and four batted passes his senior year. 247 Sports reports that he received offers from 17 schools — including USC, LSU, Oregon, Texas A&M and Mississippi State — before signing with the Rebels. He enrolled at Mississippi in January. Months later, Adams posted pictures on Instagram of himself taking part in spring practice. Mississippi football said in an X (formerly Twitter) post that it was "devastated" to learn of Adams' passing. "They provided life-saving measures until Shelby County Fire arrived. Shelby County Fire personnel later pronounced the victim deceased on the scene." Upon arrival at Fern Glade Cove, deputies found multiple shell casings and learned the four adult males arrived by personal vehicles to area hospitals with gunshot wounds. All four victims are listed in non-critical condition. "Adams was a three-star recruit in the class of 2025. The Louisiana native was a two-time, first-team all-state player, according to his bio on the Ole Miss site, and had 31 sacks over his final two seasons of high school football. He was the New Orleans Times-Picayune defensive player of the year in 2024. He was one of 23 signees in Ole Miss' class of 2025 that ranked 15th in the country, according to Rivals.
